BEAGOOD SAMARITAN! CALL 911 If you suspect an opioid overdose,

administer naloxone, call 911, and administer CPR.

Under Washington's "911 Good Samaritan Law," if you think someone is overdosing and you seek medical help for the victim, neither of you will be charged for possessing or using drugs.

The Good Sam Law will *not* protect you from being arrested for

- outstanding warrants
- probation or parole violations
- drug dealing
- crimes other than drug possession
